# MINUTE OF THE BILATERAL CONSULTATIONS MEETING HELD IN ORAVIŢA, ROMANIA,

IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE ART.5 OF ESPOO CONVENTION ON ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT ASSESSMENT REPORT OF THE INVESTMENT PROPOSAL: CONSTRUCTION OF TPP KOSTOLAC B UNIT B3, BY SERBIA

A. Location and participants at the consultation between authorities meeting

Today, 31st of August 2017, starting at 17.00 hrs, at "Casa de Cultură Mihai Eminescu", 1 December 1918 street, no. 3, Oravița, Romania, a bilateral consultation meeting was conducted for the Environmental Impact Assessment Report (EIA-R) of the investment proposal "CONSTRUCTION OF TPP KOSTOLAC B UNIT B3".

In accordance with the Article 5 of the Convention on environmental impact assessment in a trans-boundary context (Espoo Convention), a Serbian delegation participated in the consultation meeting agreed with the Romanian Ministry of Environment on the documentation for the environmental impact assessment (EIA Report) of the investment proposal "CONSTRUCTION OF TPP KOSTOLAC B UNIT B3".

#### Level of representation:

The Serbian delegation was represented by Mr. Alexandar Vesic, Assistant Minister, Ministry of Environmental Protection Serbia, and the Romanian delegation was represented by Ms. Doina Catrinoiu, Vicepresident of the National Environmental Protection Agency.

Ms. Dorina Mocanu, General Director of General Directorate for Impact Assessment and Pollution Control was the moderator of the meeting.

The consultation session between the authorities took place after the public debate.

Taking this into consideration, the delegations agreed that the presentation of the project and of the EIA Report were not necessary because they were addressed during the public debate. The two delegations mentioned in Annex 1 to the Minutes agreed on the following:

- the minutes of the public debate and consultation between the authorities will be drafted in English by the Romanian side and the drafts will be forwarded to the Serbian side for comments and additions.
- the circulation of documents will be done through the two focal points on the Espoo Convention in Serbia and Romania.
- The Serbian side will respond as quickly as possible to every question / comment from the Bankwatch NGO.
- after receiving these answers, the Romanian side will finish the minute of the public hearing.
- the purpose of this consultation between authorities is to establish the requirements of the Romanian part to be included in the Final Decision for the project to be issued by Serbia.

Romania presented the requirements that belong to the post-project monitoring, based on the application of the provisions of art.7 of the Espoo Convention regarding carrying out a post-project analysis by means of surveillance/monitoring of the activity.

These requirements to be provided for in the Final Decision that will be issued by Serbia are as follows:

- 1. application of art.7 of the Espoo Convention regarding carrying out a post-project analysis by means of surveillance/monitoring of the activity
- 2. air monitoring: annual transmission to Romania of monitoring reports for pollutant emissions in the air, measured by the JP EPS operator with the existing equipment network.
- 3. water monitoring: annual transmission of a monitoring report on Danube waters upstream and downstream of Kostolac B TPP, the measurements being made at existing national grid points as well as a self-monitoring report by the JP EPS operator after commissioning of Unit B3 (frequency of monitoring once a month, frequency of reports annual).

Serbia agreed with the Romanian requirements and they will be included in the final decision that will be issued by Serbia for this project.

The Minute was prepared and signed in two original copies in English at Oravita, on 31st of August 2017.
